China Town Hall: The Tech Economy



CBSI Virtual Panel Series I: Saving Lives and Livelihoods: What the US Can Learn from Other Nations?

In particular, the event highlighted how US deficiencies in coordinating the public health response and implementing international collaboration could be compared to the successes in East Asia and other nations. The evening's highlight was the informative speech delivered by Jeremy Howard, an entrepreneur, business strategist, developer, and Senior Researcher in the USF program in informatics.

Professor Xiaohua Yang, CBSI Director and Professor of International Business, spoke on Silicon Valley Investment Channel: How did the pandemic crisis disrupt global supply chain: Efficiency vs resilience on August 21, 2020, hosted by David Cao, Found and CEO, F50: https://youtu.be/6X-YjKD_BDE. During the program, she discussed how a connected global market was abruptly shattered by Covid-19 and how the pandemic crisis disrupted global supply chains that multinational firms had been building the last few decades. Dr. Yang made recommendations to firms on how to build resilience in global supply chains. Thousands of people watched Professor Yang's speech on social media.



How Did Being Nimble and Proactive Save China AGI?

The CBSI's China AGI course led by professors Roger Chen and Liang Wang had original plan to take students to visit Shenzhen, China during the spring break March 9-15, 2020. Everything was set to go. In facing the coronavirus outbreak in China in January, the faculty, in a very short time, managed to design a completely new local China-Silicon Valley immersion experience for students, both academically sound and practically exciting to students. Everything was set to go again at the beginning of March when the coronavirus outbreak occurred in the US. The faculty again managed to change the entire visit into an online mode, and ISAP students partnered in the change process. This course's adaption is an excellent example of how USF and CBSI put students' safety first while ensuring the quality of learning. Throughout the process, the CBSI faculty received excellent support from both the university and the school leadership. The students enjoyed virtual visits to many Silicon Valley companies, including Symbio, MoreHealth, We-Work, and One Piece among others and they also took in some excellent lectures from USF and industry experts.

Dr. Liang Wang Awarded SSHRC Insight Development Grant!

Dr. Wang. Dr. Liang Wang's research project "Exploring Meta-organization and Collective Action for Sustainable Development," with Professor Wan Li at the University of New Brunswick, has been awarded the Insight Development Grants in the amount of CAD\$51,958 by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC). SSHRC is a Canadian federal research-funding agency that promotes and supports post-secondary research and training in the humanities and social sciences.

Chen's research focuses on corporate social responsibility, social media strategies, startup and entrepreneurial public relations, and crisis communication and management. Her work has been published in leading refereed journals, including Journal of Public Relations Research, Public Relations Review, Internet Research, and Journal of Product and Brand Management. She is co-author of the upcoming book Strategic Communication for Startups and Entrepreneurs in China (Routledge Taylor & Francis). She received her Ph.D., Communication from the University of Miami.

The Center (known colloquially as Nichibunken) was established in 1987 in the Arashiyama district of Kyoto, where it has become one of the preeminent institutions promoting international research in multiple disciplines of Japanese Studies. He joined the advisory board of the Center for Gary Snyder Studies at Shanghai University of Finance and Economics, where he plans to participate in various environmental projects and initiatives in the coming years. Professor Roger Chen successfully published three articles on the Strategy and innovation of Chinese companies. 
