Among the panelists were Dr. Sfeir Younis, a Chilean economist and former Director of the World Bank (Geneva) and Special Representative at the United Nations, Dr. Ron Nahser, Provost Emeritus of Presidio Graduate School, who developed their MPA and MBA programs on sustainability.
